MINUTES OF MEETING OF MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE OF SARDAR KAURA KHAN TRUST (REGISTERED), MUZAFFARGARH HELD ON 22.04.2026 AT 12:30 P.M UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE DISTRICT & SESSIONS JUDGE/CHAIRMAN SARDAR KAURA KHAN TRUST, MUZAFFARGARH.

In pursuance of Rule 4 Sub rule 2 of the Notification No.SOR-(LG)38-24/2015 dated 04.03.2016; a meeting of the Management Committee of Sardar Kaura Khan Trust, Muzaffargarh was convened on **22.04.2026** at **12:30 P:M** under the Chairmanship of the District and Sessions Judge/Chairman Sardar Kaura Khan Trust, Muzaffargarh. The following Officers were physically present in the meeting: -

3. The District Police Officer, Muzaffargarh did not attend the meeting in person, rather Mr. Zaffar Iqbal, S.P Investigation, Muzaffargarh attended the meeting on his behalf.

4. The District Police Officer, Rajanpur did not attend the meeting and remained absent from the meeting without any intimation. The Committee formally recorded its displeasure regarding his absence.

5. The Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Muzaffargarh was also invited to participate in the meeting for their valuable assistance and support who was attend the meeting through Video link.

6. The Deputy Director Anti-corruption, Muzaffargarh, Deputy Conservator of Forest, Muzaffargarh and Tehsildar SKKT, Muzaffargarh have also attended the meeting.

7. The Chair welcomed all participants and members of the Management Committee. The agenda items were taken up for discussion, and the following decisions were unanimously/ accordingly made.

(AGENDA NO.01)

(PROGRESS OF RECOVERY STATUS FROM LEASE HOLDERS)

8. The Tehsildar, SKKT, Muzaffargarh apprised the Committee that an amount of **Rs.11,26,39,718/-** has been recovered from the leaseholders and defaulters w.e.f. 12.03.2026 to 20.04.2026 of Kharif Crop.

9. The Committee acknowledge the above said recovery. However, all field staff were strictly directed to make every possible effort to enhance both past and current recovery of the Trust. Maximum outstanding dues must be recovered from the allottees without delay. Necessary legal and administrative actions should be taken, wherever required to ensure compliance.

10. Accordingly, the Committee unanimously resolved that a comprehensive performance evaluation audit of all hired Recovery Staff be conducted, taking into account their individual recovery achievements, field activity, discipline, and overall conduct during the tenure. In case their performance is found satisfactory and in line with the assigned targets, the Committee shall consider extension/continuation of their services for a further period. However, in case of unsatisfactory performance, their services shall be discontinued forthwith, without any further notice.

11. For this purpose, the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Muzaffargarh, was assigned the task to carry out a thorough and impartial evaluation of the Recovery Staff (Performance audit) and to submit a detailed report along with

clear recommendations to this office well before the next meeting of the Committee. The Chief Officer District Council, Muzaffargarh/ Secretary, shall extend necessary assistance to facilitate the evaluation process.

(AGENDA NO.02)

INITIATION OF STEPS TAKEN AGAINST THE EX-LAND SUPERINTENDENT, SARDAR KAUR KHAN TRUST, MUZAFFARGARH AND EX-RECOVERY CLERK IN PURSUANCE OF INQUIRY REPORTS SUBMITTED BY MR. GHULAM SHABBIR HUSSAIN, LEARNED ADDITIONAL DISTRICT & SESSIONS JUDGE, JATOI.

12. The progress report regarding recovery of the embezzled amount, initiation of departmental proceedings, and registration of criminal cases with the Anti-Corruption Establishment (Circle Office), Muzaffargarh, against Muhammad Raffique Gujjar, Ex-Land Superintendent, and Muhammad Raza Imran, Ex-Recovery Clerk, Sardar Kaura Khan Trust, Muzaffargarh, was reviewed by the Committee.

13. It was informed to the Committee that Mr. Muhammad Raza Imran, Ex-Recovery Clerk, has been awarded the major penalty of removal from service on account of absence from duty by the Chief Executive Officer, District Health Authority, Muzaffargarh, under Section 4(1), Sub-Head (b), Clause (v) of the Punjab Employees Efficiency, Discipline and Accountability Act, 2006, vide order No. 7946-54/CEO (DHA) dated 15.04.2026.

14. The Deputy Director (Anti-Corruption), Muzaffargarh, apprised the Committee that an amount of Rs. 58,000/- has so far been recovered from the Ex-Land Superintendent, Sardar Kaura Khan Trust, Muzaffargarh. It was further informed that efforts are being made for the arrest of Ali Raza, Ex-Recovery Clerk, who is reportedly evading arrest. The Committee, after due consideration, expressed serious concern and displeasure over the unsatisfactory pace of recovery and the failure to apprehend the accused person despite lapse of sufficient time. The Chair observed that such delay reflects lack of effective follow-up and coordination on the part of the concerned authorities. Accordingly, the Deputy Director (Anti-Corruption), Muzaffargarh, was strictly directed to intensify efforts for recovery of the embezzled amount by adopting all available legal measures. Furthermore, immediate and concrete

steps shall be taken to ensure the arrest of the absconding accused, Ali Raza, without any further delay and progress report be submitted in the next meeting.

15. It was apprised to the Committee that formal notices have already been issued to the above-mentioned Government Departments, directing them to clear all outstanding rent dues up to March, 2026, without further delay, or to vacate the occupied buildings in case of non-payment. However, despite issuance of such notices, no tangible progress has been made so far, and the outstanding amounts remain unpaid. The Committee, after detailed deliberation, expressed serious concern over the lack of response and non-compliance on the part of the concerned departments. It was observed that the continued unauthorized occupation of Trust properties without payment of rent is causing significant financial loss to the Trust and reflects poor coordination among the departments concerned.

16. Accordingly, the Committee assigned the task to the Chief Officer, District Council, Muzaffargarh/Secretary to take up the matter on priority basis with the concerned departments and ensure prompt clearance of all outstanding dues. The Chief Officer/Secretary shall also explore all available legal and administrative measures, including issuance of final notices, initiation of recovery proceedings, and, where necessary, steps for eviction in accordance with law.

17. The Committee further directed that a comprehensive progress report, indicating department-wise recovery status and actions taken, shall be submitted to this office within 02-week.

(AGENDA NO.04)

(BALANCE AMOUNT OF RS.100 MILLION AVAILABLE WITH THE LOCAL GOVT. OF PUNJAB IN ACCOUNT-IV, CMA NO.5837/16 OUTSTANDING AMOUNT OF TRUST PAGE 06 TO 07 AND INQUIRY REPORT OF WORTHY DISTRICT & SESSIONS JUDGE, DATED 10.07.2015 PAGE NO.18)

18. The Committee took up the above-said agenda item, and it was apprised that the Land Superintendent, Sardar Kaura Khan Trust, Muzaffargarh, has submitted a report bearing No. 194/SL dated 20.04.2026. As per the said report, an FIR bearing No. 38/15 under Sections 420, 406, 409, 471, and 468 of the Pakistan Penal Code, along with Section 5(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1947, was registered at Police Station Anti-Corruption on account of non-provision of record/evidence regarding income for the period from 2001 to 2014. It was further apprised that during the proceedings of HRC No. 45/1993, it had been represented before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of Pakistan by the then District Coordination Officer (DCO), Executive District Officer (Finance & Planning), and Ex-Land Superintendent, SKKT, Muzaffargarh, that the amount in question had already been deposited/transferred into the Trust Account. However, no documentary proof in support of the said claim is presently available on record. In order to verify the factual position, a written request has been made to the Manager, Bank of Punjab, Muzaffargarh, for provision of the relevant bank statements pertaining to the aforesaid period.

19. After detailed deliberation, the Chair directed the Land Superintendent, SKKT, Muzaffargarh, to pursue the matter vigorously and ensure that the requisite bank statements/record are obtained from the concerned bank within a period of one week. The same shall be submitted to this office for verification and for taking further necessary action strictly in accordance with law. Any delay or negligence in compliance of these directions shall be viewed seriously.

APPLICATIONS REGARDING VARIOUS LOTS, THE AREA IS LESS OR THE LAND IS BARREN AND RIVER-ERODED LOTS NO.167/1 & 194/1 MOUZA RAMPUR-III

20. Report submitted by the Patwari & Tehsildar, SKKT Muzaffargarh perused and found incomplete. The Tehsildar SKKT,

Muzaffargarh is directed to obtain fresh report from Revenue Department as well as Field staff of Sardar Kara Khan Trust, Muzaffargarh within a 10-days alongwith pictorial evidence.

AGENDA NO.06)
(APPLICATION REGARDING ILLEGAL OCCUPANT AT LOT
NO.01 MAUZA NOORPUR, TEHSIL RAJANPUR)

21. The Committee considered an application submitted by one Mr. Sadaqat Hussain, wherein he stated that Lot No. 01, situated in Mauza Noorpur, Tehsil Rajanpur, had been allotted to him vide letter No. 65/SL dated 03.01.2026; however, physical possession of the said property has not yet been handed over to him due to illegal occupation by unauthorized persons.

22. Upon consideration, the Committee expressed serious concern over the matter and observed that the rightful allottee has been deprived of possession without any lawful justification. Accordingly, the Deputy Commissioner, Rajanpur, was strictly directed to take immediate action to get the land vacated from illegal occupants and ensure that peaceful and vacant possession of the said lot is handed over to the actual allottee within a period of one week.

23. Furthermore, the Chief Officer, District Council, Muzaffargarh/Secretary, SKKT, Muzaffargarh, and Tehsildar, SKKT, Muzaffargarh, were directed to closely coordinate with the office of the Deputy Commissioner, Rajanpur, and extend full assistance to ensure compliance of these directions.

AGENDA NO.07.
(APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY MR. GHULAM RASOOL
REGARDING LOT NO.7, JATOI)

24. Mr. Awaid Irshad Bhatti, Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Muzaffargarh, apprised the Committee that a reference has been forwarded to the Member, Colonies, Board of Revenue, Lahore, regarding Lot No. 07, Mouza Jatoi Janoobi, Transfer No. 6133 dated 23.11.2005, along with the encroachment matter pertaining to Sardar Kaura Khan Trust, Muzaffargarh, vide Letter No. 56/HCC dated 23.02.2026, seeking necessary guidance in the matter. However, the response from the Colonies Board of Revenue, Lahore is still awaited.

25. Upon perusal of the said reference, it was observed that the date of mutation had inadvertently been mentioned as 23.11.2025 instead of the correct date i.e. 23.11.2005. The Committee viewed this discrepancy seriously and directed that the same be rectified immediately. Accordingly, the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Muzaffargarh, was directed to correct the aforesaid error forthwith and to actively pursue the matter with the Colonies Board of Revenue, Lahore, for early response and resolution of the issue. A progress report in this regard shall be submitted to this office before the next meeting.

26. The Deputy Director Agriculture, Muzaffargarh submitted his report regarding lot No.112/1 Mouza Rampur-I, Tehsil Jatoi vide letter No.1140/DDA/Dev. Dated 07.04.2026 which was perused. Let fresh report from the Tehsildar of SKKT, Muzaffargarh and field staff of SKKT Muzaffargarh as well as Revenue Department concerned be obtained with a week to this office for further process.

AGENDA NO.09.
(ILLEGAL OCCUPANTS LOTS OF SARDAR KAURA KHAN
TRUST)

- a. Lot No. 03, 26, 27 & 28 Mouza Jatoi Shumali.**
- b. 35 Nos. lots of Mouza Daira Kaura**

27. Mr. Ghulam Shabbir Hussain, Additional District & Sessions Judge, Jatoi, submitted a report regarding eviction proceedings in respect of Lot Nos. 41 to 45, situated in Mouza Dera Kaura Khan, Tehsil Jatoi. As per the contents of the report, the aforesaid lots have been successfully vacated from illegal occupants and peaceful possession thereof has been delivered to Mr. Muhammad Tahir, the lawful allottee. Accordingly, the report was placed on record and the matter, to that extent, was treated as disposed of. However, the Committee directed the concerned office to initiate and ensure recovery of all outstanding dues from the said allottee strictly in accordance with law, without any delay. Furthermore, with regard to the remaining pending matters relating to illegal occupation of Trust lands, Mr. Ghulam Shabbir

Hussain, Additional District & Sessions Judge, Jatoi, was directed to expedite the proceedings and decide all such cases within a period of 15-days, ensuring that due process of law is followed. A compliance/progress report shall be submitted to this office within the stipulated timeframe.

28. The Tehsildar, Sardar Kaura Khan Trust (SKKT), Muzaffargarh, apprised the Committee that certain difficulties and security concerns are being faced at Dera Kaura due to the activities and interference of criminal elements, which are adversely affecting the functioning and management of Trust affairs in the said area. Taking serious notice of the matter, the Chair expressed grave concern over the situation and directed the Superintendent of Police (Investigation), Muzaffargarh, to take immediate and appropriate legal action against the involved elements, ensure provision of adequate security.

AGENDA NO.10.
(E-TAGGING OF TREE)

29. The Deputy Forest Officer, Muzaffargarh apprised the Committee that the field staff does not possess the requisite expertise for E-Tagging of trees; however, the department's staff is available for manual numbering and related field assistance. He further informed the Committee that only one official is presently posted in the concerned area, whereas a large number of trees require tagging, and therefore requested that staff of Sardar Kaura Khan Trust (SKKT) be deployed for the protection and supervision of the aforesaid trees.

30. It was further informed that a report regarding tagging of trees has already been submitted by the Forest Department. After detailed discussion, the Committee observed that verification of existing tagged trees is necessary to ensure accuracy and transparency of record.

31. Accordingly, the field staff was directed to verify all trees presently available/recorded in the office record and submit a comprehensive verification report to this office before the next meeting. The Deputy Forest Department shall extend full cooperation in this regard to ensure proper implementation of the tagging process.

AGENDA NO.11.
(CANAL WATER FOR LOTS OF SKKT LANDS)

32. The canal water schedule submitted by the Irrigation Department was placed before the Committee and discussed in detail. After consideration, the Committee directed that the Land Superintendent and Tehsildar, Sardar Kaura Khan Trust (SKKT), Muzaffargarh, shall closely monitor the availability and distribution of canal water to the Trust lands, particularly those lots situated adjacent to the irrigation canal system. They shall ensure that water is being supplied in accordance with the approved schedule and intended allocations.

AGENDA NO.12.
(TRANSFER OF LAND OF ZILA COUNCIL, MUZAFFARGARH TO THE SARDAR KAURA KHAN PUBLIC SCHOOL FREE OF COST)

33. The aforesaid agenda item was deferred and shall be placed for consideration in the next meeting for discussion and appropriate decision.

AGENDA NO.13.
(REQUEST FOR PURCHASE OF 05-MOTORCYCLE FOR PATWARIES AND RECOVERY PERSONNELS)

34. After detailed discussion, the Committee decided that the matter shall be taken up for consideration after receipt and evaluation report of the field staff, i.e., Patwaris and Recovery Personnel, from the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Muzaffargarh.

AGENDA NO.14.
PROPOSAL OF VOLUNTARY APPOINTMENT AS ASSISTANT LEGAL ADVISOR FOR TRUST MATTERS.

35. The matter regarding the proposed appointment of an Assistant Legal Advisor for Sardar Kaura Khan Trust was taken up and discussed at length by the Committee. It was apprised that, in view of the nature of Trust affairs, legal assistance is regularly required in Tax, Civil and Criminal matters to safeguard the interests of the Trust and ensure timely and proper legal compliance.

36. During the course of discussion, the Deputy Commissioner, Muzaffargarh made a valuable and well-considered suggestion that instead of engaging legal assistance on an adhoc

basis, the services of legal advisors may preferably be obtained from the duly notified panel maintained by the Ministry of Law and Justice, Government of Pakistan, so as to ensure transparency, merit and adherence to the prescribed legal framework.

37. After due deliberation, the Committee agreed with the said proposal and directed that the office shall obtain the updated panel/list of approved legal advisors from the Ministry of Law and Justice. The said list shall be placed before the Committee in the next meeting for consideration and for taking a final decision regarding the appointment of Assistant Legal Advisor(s) for the Trust.

AGENDA NO.15.

INCREASE SALARY PACKAGE TEACHING AND NON-TEACHING STAFF OF SKKT SCHOOLS

38. In view of the prevailing high inflation across the country, the need to provide financial relief to the low-paid employees and in order to maintain parity with the **minimum wage policy of the Government of the Punjab**, the Management Committee, after detailed consideration, unanimously decided to revise and fix the minimum monthly salary package of the teaching and non-teaching staff of Sardar Kaura Khan Trust (SKKT) Schools with effect from **01.04.2026**, as under:-

Sr. No	Name of post	Minimum Salary
01	Vice Principal	Rs.50000/- Per month
02	Teachers	Rs.45000/- Per month
03	Computer Operator/ Clerk	Rs.45000/- Per month
04	Class-IV Employee	Rs.40000/-Per month.

39. The Committee observed that the above revision is aimed at improving service conditions, enhancing motivation, and ensuring retention of competent staff in the educational institutions run under the Trust. The office is directed to issue necessary formal orders accordingly and ensure implementation of the revised salary structure with effect from the stipulated date, strictly in accordance with the decision of the Committee.

AGENDA NO.16.

(PAYMENT OF PREVIOUS BILL OF SARDAR KAURA KHAN TRUST SCHOOL, KOT ADDU)

40. The bills of Sardar Kaura Khan Trust School, Kot Addu, pertaining to the months of July 2025 and August 2025, amounting to Rs.19,200/- and Rs.23,640/- respectively, were placed before the Committee for consideration and approval of payment.

41. After detailed discussion, the Committee observed that, prior to release of payment, proper verification of the said bills is necessary to ensure accuracy, authenticity, and financial propriety. Accordingly, it was unanimously decided that the said bills shall be subjected to thorough verification before any payment is processed. For this purpose, the matter is referred to Mr. Tahir Bashir, Principal, Sardar Kaura Khan Public School, Muzaffargarh/Member of the Committee as well as Director of Schools of Sardar Kaura Khan Trust, who shall verify the authenticity and correctness of the said bills in detail and submit a report along with his recommendations in the next meeting of the Committee for further necessary action.

AGENDA NO.17.

(SCHOOL MATTERS)

(RENOVATION OF SCHOOLS)

(URGENT NEED FOR STRENGTHENING THE SECURITY MEASURES)

42. In the previous meeting, the following rough cost estimates of the works detailed below were prepared and submitted by the Executive Engineer (Buildings), Muzaffargarh:-

04	Rough Cost Estimate for installation of Razor Cut wire at Sardar Kaura Khan Trust School, Kot Addu	9,81,800/-

43. The Chair highlighted that the proposed renovation works are essential for improvement of educational infrastructure, whereas installation of razor cut wire is urgently required for strengthening security arrangements and ensuring safety of students and school premises.

44. The Committee discussed the above-mentioned proposals in detail and after due deliberation, unanimously approved the aforesaid rough cost estimates. It was resolved that necessary steps be initiated forthwith for execution of the approved works in accordance with applicable rules and financial regulations. It was further unanimously decided that for carrying forward the matter and to undertake all codal formalities relating to procurement and tendering process, the following Committee is hereby constituted:-

1. **The Additional Deputy Commissioner** (Finance & Planning), Muzaffargarh.
2. **The Executive Engineer**, Buildings Division, Muzaffargarh.

45. The aforesaid Committee shall proceed further in accordance with law, complete all codal requirements, process the tendering proceedings and take necessary steps for timely execution of the approved works, while ensuring transparency and observance of all prescribed procedures.

(ESTABLISHMENT OF NURSING COLLEGE)

46. The Committee reviewed in detail the judgment/order of the August Supreme Court of Pakistan dated 11.10.2018 and particularly deliberated upon the observations made in paragraphs No. 5 and 6 thereof regarding advancement of the vision of late Sardar Kaura Khan through promotion of education, technical training and healthcare facilities in the area. The Committee noted with appreciation that the Hon'ble Supreme Court had emphasized establishment of a Polytechnical Institute in the name of late Sardar Kaura Khan and subject to feasibility, a Training School for paramedical staff on land to be provided by the Trust, besides expressing expectation that the Government of the Punjab and other competent authorities would take forward the mission of late Sardar Kaura Khan by allocating appropriate funds for these welfare-oriented projects aimed at uplift of one of the most

underdeveloped areas of the country. The Committee acknowledged the significance of the said observations and resolved that the same be kept under active consideration for practical implementation in accordance with the vision reflected in the aforesaid judgment.

47. The Committee unanimously acknowledged the above-referred directions/observations of the August Supreme Court of Pakistan and discussed modalities for exploring the feasibility of establishment of the proposed institutions. In this regard, the Chair apprised the Committee that, as a preliminary step, a meeting had been convened with Aga Khan University Hospital through Webinar/Video Link to seek expert guidance and possible collaboration regarding the proposed initiatives. The Committee was informed that Aga Khan University Hospital regretted its inability to take up the matter, considering the remoteness of the area and related operational constraints and advised that the proposal may be pursued with Indus Hospital & Health Network for possible assistance and collaboration.

48. After detailed discussion accordingly, the task was assigned to the Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue), Muzaffargarh, who shall liaise with Indus Hospital & Health Network hold meetings/discussions and explore all possible modalities for establishment of the proposed Nursing College and Polytechnical Institute under the Trust.

(MERIT BASED SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR TALENTED AND DESERVING STUDENTS)

49. A proposed Scholarship Policy along with its implementation mechanism for the students of Tehsil Jampur and Tehsil Jatoi has been prepared and placed before the Committee. The Committee observed that, prior to its formal implementation, the said policy requires detailed review and input from all Members of the Management Committee to ensure transparency, fairness, and effective execution. Accordingly, it was unanimously decided that the draft Scholarship Policy shall be circulated among all Members of the Management Committee for their examination and comments. In case no objections or suggestions are received within the stipulated time, the said policy shall be deemed approved and shall be implemented accordingly.

(RECRUITMENT OF TEACHERS ETC.)

50. In pursuance of the previous minutes of meeting advertisement of the teaching and non-teaching staff has been published and applications against the posts also been received in this office. After detail discussion the Committee decided to constitute the recruitment committees as under:-

(AUCTION OF CANTEENS SKKT SCHOOLS)

51. This agenda was postpone and will be discussed in the next meeting.

(CONSTRUCTION OF WATER PLANTS AT SKKT SCHOOL, JATOI AND KOT ADDU)

52. In continuation of the earlier decision of the Management Committee regarding installation of water filtration plants at Sardar Kaura Khan Trust Schools, the Committee was apprised that, through coordination with an NGO, progress has

been made towards provision of clean drinking water facilities in the schools. It was further informed that installation of the water filtration plant at Sardar Kaura Khan Trust School, Alipur is near completion, whereas installation of the water filtration plant at Sardar Kaura Khan Trust School, Jatoi is presently underway. The Committee expressed satisfaction over the progress achieved and appreciated the efforts undertaken in this regard. The concerned officers were directed to ensure completion of the installation process at Jatoi School at the earliest and to submit a progress/completion report in the next meeting.

53. The Chair further specifically directed that electric water coolers/drinking water coolers be connected and made fully operational with the water filtration plants at the concerned schools so as to ensure provision of chilled and safe drinking water to students, particularly during the summer season

(INSTALLATION OF SOLAR SYSTEM AT SKKT SCHOOLS JATOI, ALIPUR AND KOT ADDU)

54. The Committee took up the agenda regarding installation of solar systems at Sardar Kaura Khan Trust Schools located at Jatoi, Alipur and Kot Addu. The Chair observed that in view of increasing electricity costs, frequent power outages and the need to ensure uninterrupted educational activities, provision of solar energy at the said institutions has become necessary. It was further observed that installation of solar systems would not only provide sustainable and uninterrupted power supply for classrooms, laboratories, fans, lights and allied facilities, but would also substantially reduce recurring utility expenditures of the Trust in the long run.

55. The matter was discussed in detail and the Committee unanimously agreed in principle that solarization of the said schools is a beneficial and welfare-oriented initiative. The Chair emphasized that the proposal would contribute towards improved learning environment for students and strengthen institutional infrastructure. It was accordingly resolved that feasibility and rough cost estimates for installation of solar systems at SKKT Schools Jatoi, Alipur and Kot Addu be obtained from the concerned technical department/competent authority for consideration in the next meeting.

56. *It was further resolved that upon receipt of feasibility report and cost estimates, the matter shall be placed before the Committee for approval and further necessary action in accordance with Trust rules and codal formalities. The Chair directed that the proposal be processed on priority basis so that the project may be pursued at the earliest in the larger interest of the institutions and students.*

57. *In addition, the Deputy Commissioner, Rajanpur, requested the Committee to consider provision/installation of a Solar system for DPS School, Rajanpur.*

58. *The Chair, after due consideration, advised that a formal written request along with complete justification, technical details, and estimated cost be submitted to this office for examination. It was further observed that any such proposal shall be considered strictly in accordance with the financial rules and policies governing the Sardar Kaura Khan Trust.*

59. *The Committee, therefore, decided that upon receipt of the formal request, the same shall be placed before the Committee.*

Additional Items.

60. *Mr. Tahir Bashir, Director School Affairs, Sardar Kaura Khan Public Schools and Member of the Management Committee, submitted a comprehensive proposal regarding the Assessment, Evaluation and Rationalization of Staff for the Academic Session 2026-27. Through the said proposal, he sought administrative approval to initiate the evaluation process in accordance with the proposed schedule, along with the nomination of a technical expert from the District Education Authority, Muzaffargarh, to ensure transparency and technical soundness of the process.*

61. *Upon due consideration and perusal of the proposal, the Chair was pleased to direct the Chief Executive Officer (District Education Authority), Muzaffargarh, to nominate a suitable and competent technical expert at the earliest. The Chief Executive Officer (DEA), Muzaffargarh, was further directed to ensure that the nomination is made promptly in coordination with the*

concerned authorities so that the evaluation process may be commenced without any delay.

62. The Committee, after due deliberation, unanimously approved the provision and installation of two LED screens for the Play Class and one LED screen for the Principal's Office of school Alipur, to facilitate effective monitoring through the CCTV camera system. The Committee further approved the provision and installation of one Air Conditioner for the Play Group/ Class of each school, in order to ensure a conducive, comfortable, and child-friendly learning environment for the students.

63. The Committee took up the matter regarding strengthening of Computer Labs and provision of I.T and allied office equipment for the institutions functioning under the Trust. The Chair observed that keeping in view the growing importance of information technology and the need to equip students with modern digital learning facilities, establishment/upgradation of computer labs has become imperative. After detailed deliberations, the Committee unanimously resolved that procurement of the following I.T. equipment and allied items be made through open tender in accordance with prescribed rules and codal formalities, and for this purpose an advertisement be published in the newspapers inviting bids from eligible firms/suppliers:-

1. Computer Sets — 20 Nos.
2. Computer Desks — 20 Nos.
3. Computer Chairs — 20 Nos.

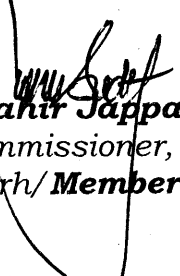
64. The Committee further resolved that the procurement process shall be undertaken in a transparent manner through open competition to ensure quality, economy and compliance with all applicable procurement rules. It was further directed that necessary specifications of the required equipment be finalized and tender proceedings be initiated at the earliest so that the computer lab facilities may be strengthened and made functional for the benefit of students.

65. The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks extended to all the participants, expressing appreciation for their attendance, contributions and able assistance.
